In Memory Of Sakia Gunn

May 26, 1987 - May 11, 2003

Newark Pride Week was founded shortly after the horrific death of Sakia Gunn, a teenager targeted and murdered because of her sexual orientation in the heart of downtown Newark.

Tatyana Fazalizadeh completed her mural "Sakia, Sakia, Sakia, Sakia" as a part of the Gateways to Newark Project. She felt the importance of painting a tribute to the slain youth's life. Sakia was a young, black, queer girl who deserved to be seen and her story heard. Artist Fazlalizadeh says, "while painting, many people drove by a yelled out her name. A few people got out of their cars to tell me they knew her. This is the stu! that public art is good for."

Through grassroots organizing, Newark's LGBTQ community advocated for safe spaces and programming. Newark's LGTBQ community knows Sakia; we will never forget her now. Sakia Gunn's legacy will live on as her story will be included in the new LGBTQ curriculum taught in New Jersey schools.

About Newark LGBT Pride

Newark LGBTQ Pride Week is a signature event series that provides entertainment opportunities but also raises awareness for its year-long agenda of social, educational, and cultural programs for adults, youth, families, and allies.

In 2005, Newark Pride, Inc. held its inaugural Pride celebration. Over 15 years later, Newark Pride has evolved with the city's changing landscape and has grown into a regionally anticipated event, drawing thousands of people to Newark's Downtown Business District.

Hosted in the heart of downtown Newark, Newark Pride events are held in areas brimming with activities, attractions, and adventures! These events highlight the city's vast culture and amplify the local contributions of queer people while increasing revenue and visibility for corporate sponsors and local businesses.

Indeed, Newark Pride offers a unique opportunity to view the ways the LGBTQ community is thriving concurrently with the city's cultural and economic boom. From thriving cultural institutions like NJPAC, Prudential Center, and the Newark Museum to various new restaurants, hotels, and luxury apartments transforming the downtown area - Newark is on the rise. Our History



2006

With the support of Mayor-Elect Cory Booker, Municipal Council and Essex County, the rainbow flag is raised for the first time in Newark in front of the Essex County Court as part of Pride Week.

2008

Filmmaker Charles "Chas" Brack directed and produced "Dreams Deferred: The Sakia Gunn Story".

2010

Essex County Executive Joseph N. DiVincenzo Jr. established the Essex County LGBTQ Advisory Council.

2012

The Newark LGTBQ Commission and Newark's Youth Policy LGBTQ youth sub-committee published an LGBTQ Youth Position paper providing recommendations for creating a safer and more supportive environment for LGBTQ youth throughout the city. Mayor Cory Booker endorsed the paper.

2005

In July, the first Newark Gay Pride is held in Military Park under the direction of founder June Dowell-Burton.

2007

Mayor Cory Booker, Councilwoman Dana Rone, June Dowell-Burton, and Reverend Janyce Jackson raised the rainbow flag at the Newark City Hall for the first time to commemorate the beginning of Pride Week.

2009

Newark becomes the first city in the state to form an LGBTQ Advisory Concerns Commission. "Dreams Deferred" screened at 35th Annual Newark Black Film Festival hosted by the Newark Museum.

2011

President Barack Obama invited Newark Gay Pride to the inaugural LGBTQ Pride month reception at the White House on June 29th. Newark Pride Alliance and the Hetrick-Martin Institute launched HMI To Go (an after-school LGBTQ program) realizing one of the official promises made after the death of Sakia Gunn. Rutgers University launched "Queer Newark: Oral History Project" to share and record the stories of three generations of LGBTQ Newark residents.

Despite the nation facing a global pandemic, Newark Pride continued to provide programming for the community, near and far! In **June** 2020, Sharronda Wheeler was featured on Queer Newark OHP. In October 2020, she was also listed as #39 on Insider NJ's Out 100 LGBT Power List. Additionally in **October** Newark Gay Pride received the 2020 Census Appreciation Award. In **November**, Sharronda Wheeler also received an award for the 10 Newark Creators NJPAC Virtual Series.

Strength in Numbers


As of April 2021, 1,830 businesses are officially certified as LGBT Business Enterprises (LGBTBEs) by the National Gay & Lesbian Chamber of Commerce.

Of the LGBTEs that shared annual revenue estimates with the NGLCC, LGBTEs report annual revenue is \$2,475,642.

If the presumed average of \$2,475,642 in annual revenues across all certified LGBTBEs, the total annual earnings of business owners is conservertaviely estimated at more than \$1.15 billion
